Use wax crayons or an old candle to draw shoals of fish, sharks or crabs. Mark the sea bed. Then with weak blue paint or food colouring, wash over your wax drawings, take care not to scrub but let the wax resist the paint. While it is drying draw, colour and cut out your selection of more colourful fish, ship wreck, divers, etc. Tear paper shapes for rocks and thin strips of greens or browns to twist and stick onto the sea bed for seaweed. If you had a tiny bit of sand you could put a little glue on the seabed and sprinkle sand onto it to add more texture. • Log on to Purple mash – complete “To Do”.

Marching on the Spot

1. Stand with your feet hip-width apart.
2. Lift one foot and then the other.
3. Stay on the same spot.

4. Keep a straight back.



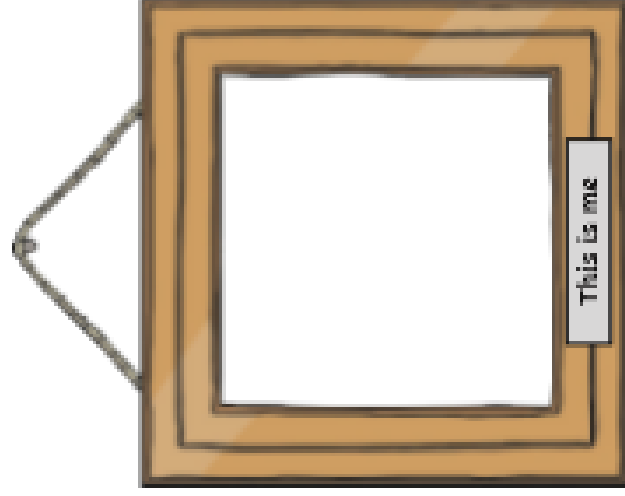
