Talk about friendships. Talk about there being different types of unkind behaviour.

Friends try and do kind things towards each other. But sometimes people are unkind to others. In what ways can people be unkind to each other?

- Calling names or saying hurtful things
- Hurting by hitting, pinching or kicking etc
- Leaving someone out
- Sending hurtful messages or saying nasty things about people using mobile phones or computers

Look at the definition of bullying, noticing the emphasis on the word "*repeatedly*" in this definition. Explain also that not many children – and not every child – will get bullied.

'How many times have you ever fallen out with your friends?' falling out happens far more often than bullying.
