Can you take a word and write a sentence incorporating that word in its past tense form. E.g glow – The enormous, orange fire glowed for many days. Can you use interesting adjectives?			
Wednesday	Explain what a headline is and what its purpose is - It needs to grab the readers attention so that they continuing reading similar a story title, it needs to provide information, sometimes they can be funny or play on words. Can you write a range of different headings you could use for a newspaper report? Think about how the headline might change after each day of the fire. <a href="https://www.funenglishgames.com/writinggames/newspaper.html">https://www.funenglishgames.com/writinggames/newspaper.html</a> – play game and comment on what makes a good heading.			
Thursday	Discuss how in some newspaper articles quotes are included these often come from people that have witnessed the event. Can you say these quotes?. E.g I couldn't believe my eyes the flames just kept on getting bigger and bigger. Discuss how quotes can differ depending on who is saying them. E.g something king Charles said maybe differ from the baker. Can you pretend to be being different characters and what they might say. Can you draw and cut out a picture of character and write a matching quote?

## History/Geography



Can you think about how The Great Fire of London impacted the fire service and the differences between the fire service they had then, and we do now? How did the lack of fire service in 1666 impacted The Great Fire?

Can you write a list of the equipment used today and in 1666? Can you draw a picture to show what these look like?

Think about how fire safety is very different now to what it has been in the past. If a fire was to happen now what we would do? what fire safety rules do we follow in school and out of school? Compare this to what fire safety rules would be in place in 1666. E.g. have a water bucket nearby, put all your belongings onto a cart. Can you think of 5 fire safety rules for 1666? Can you design a fore safety poster?

This week we are thinking about our feelings.

How would you feel if:
