

Can you make props/pictures and act out the scenes? Can somebody at home record a section of this for you to upload and share on Tapestry?	 WALT: Demonstrate active listening techniques and suggest strategies for maintaining positive relationships. When we are speaking, how do we know that the other person is really listening to us? List active listening techniques: Making eye contact Nodding head Making positive noises Not being distracted With an adult, can you demonstrate good listening skills? Why is it important to listen to others ? Conclude that problems can arise if people don't listen; it can lead to fallouts with friends. Can you think of some strategies for requiring negotiation skills to help foster and maintain positive relationships? 	This week we are learning to identify how the Christmas story tells us about the special qualities of Jesus. https://www.bbc.co.uk/teach/class-clips- video/religious-studies-ks1-the What does Christmas means to you? (presents, family, food, snow etc). Explain that Christmas is a very special time of year for Christians as it marks the birth of the baby Jesus. Watch the story of the nativity and discuss why the events make Jesus special to Christians all around the world (Son of God, visited by angels, visited by kings etc.). What do these events tell us about the special qualities of Jesus? Write a sentence about the special qualities of Jesus shown in the Christmas story. Draw a picture of a part of the Nativity.
Daily Reading	Music	
Reading Read a book from Collins Big Cat or Oxford Owl. Can you find a book at home that you can re-read and share with your family?	This week we are learning to listen with concentration and understanding to a range of high-quality live and recorded music. Put a playlist of Christmas songs on to listen to. Close your eyes and listen carefully. Discuss how it makes you feel, what do you picture in your minds? Discuss common features of some of the songs (e.g. bells, Christmas lyrics, triangles, children	

signing etc.). Can you draw a picture that relates to the songs and how you feel?
