This week we are learning to think about Christmas.

Can you safely search online Christmas traditions around the world? How do other countries celebrate Christmas?

WALT: Suggest simple strategies for resolving conflict situations

Can you draw and/or write the things you need in order to do your best in school?

Next, can you draw and/or write the things you need to do in order to help *others* do their best in school?

Discuss that there are things we need in order to do our best but we also have a responsibility for helping others get the things they need so that they can do their best. This week we are learning to understand why there are so many lights at Christmas time.

Why do you think there are so many lights put up at this time of year? (pretty, gets dark earlier, festive spirit, family activity etc). Discuss any family traditions you may have surrounding Christmas lights and what makes these special.

Christians believe that Jesus called himself 'the light of the world' (John 8:12). They believe that he is their guiding light through darkness, showing them the way and providing comfort. The lights around this time are used to symbolise this guiding light (around his birth).

Read a book from Collins Big Cat or Oxford Owl. Can you find a book at home that you can re-read and share with your family?

This week we are continuing to listen with concentration and understanding to a range of high-quality live and recorded music.

Put a playlist of Christmas songs on to listen to. Close your eyes and listen carefully. Discuss how it makes you feel, what do you picture in your minds? Discuss common features of some of the songs (e.g. bells, Christmas lyrics, triangles, children signing etc.). Can you draw a picture that relates to the songs and how you feel?

Screen time warning.

While some tasks involve a device with a screen such as an iPad, computer, laptop, tablet, phone or TV, not all tasks will require such a device.

It is important that children do not spend too much time in front of a screen (learning or having some down time) and are enjoying other activities such as colouring, drawing, playing with toys, being active, reading and interacting with those at home.
