<p><b>Phonics (up to 20 mins)</b> WALT: WALT Read some letter groups that each represent one sound and say sounds for them. WALT Blend sounds into words.</p>	<p><b>Follow the teacher video for today's phonics.</b> <b>Teacher VIDEO 1:</b> Watch and practice the sound 'ow' on BBC Bitesize Use your robot arms to practice reading the words Watch Mrs Bentham's video. Copy the sounds and write the sentence. <b>Challenge: Find one more word with our sound of the day and teach it to someone in your house.</b></p>
