Monday's Weekly Project This week we are going to be making a dinosaur habitat in a box. You can use a shoebox if you have one, or any other suitable box. Think about what you might see if you found yourself back in time in the Prehistoric world. You could use toy dinosaurs in your scene or make some from playdough or salt dough. Add a pond or river plus trees and other plants. Make sure your dinosaurs have what they need to survive, like water, food and a home. You could use natural materials you find when you go for a walk or recycled items. Be as imaginative as you like — this is YOUR dino world! Thursday Go back in time on a Jurassic Scavenger Hunt! See instructions on what to look for at the end of the sheet.

Jurassic Scavenger Hunt

If you could travel back in time to the Jurassic Period (201-145 million years ago) and look around, many plants and animals we see today would be missing. But, surprisingly, many things we see today are close relatives of plants and animals alive then. Here are some things to look out for and challenges to complete on your walk.

- 1. Collect a fallen pine cone.
- 2. Make a rubbing of monkey puzzle tree bark or pine tree bark.
- 3. Collect a feather from the floor. Some meat-eating dinosaurs had feathers (for example Anchiornis and Sciurumimus).
- 4. Find an actual dinosaur. No, not a famous Jurassic sauropod like Brachiosaurus or Diplodocus, but a genuine, modern-day dinosaur: a bird. Draw or take a photo of a bird.
- 5. Spot and take a photo of a fish or a mammal (warm-blooded, hairy, gives birth to live babies). Mammals in Jurassic times were tiny not much bigger than a mouse.
