	Phonics Phonics
Re	vise phase 2 and 3 sounds using flash cards and phase 2 and 3 tricky words every day.
Monday	New graphemes /wh/ and /ph/ Practise writing these sounds in the air and on someone's back. Play picnic on Pluto or Buried Treasure with these words: when, phen, which, phonics, wheck, graphics, wheel, whump, alphabet, craph, wheem, whisper, graph, braphics. Read these sentences: Which is a dolphin better at, jumping or swimming? Phonics is about sounds. I can whisper them or say them loud. When will you take a photo of a big wheel?
Tuesday	New grapheme /ew/. Explain that this grapheme can make two slightly different sounds as in blew and stew. Practise writing these words: blew, screw, nephew, threw, stew, grew, flew, drew, brew, few. Read these sentences: A balloon blew up in the air and flew away. My nephew is called Drew. What can you do if you find a screw in your stew? Supporting video: ew for /oo/ and /yoo/ sounds - Phonics - Bing video - Mr Thorne does Phonics.
Wednesday	We are learning to spell the tricky words: said, so, have, like. Have a go at reading these tricky words then writing them yourself- you could play Bingo and find the tricky words on your piece of paper. Read these sentences: My nephew said the alphabet. Will a dolphin whisper so that he can have a throat sweet? An elephant said he flew like a bird. Do you think that this is true?
Thursday	Write the graphemes /oe/ and /au/. Play Buried Treasure with these words: toe, goes, launch, August, poe, troes, baunch, audunk. Read these sentences: Can a toe be jaunty? Can a rocket launch in August? Will a haunted venue make you scream?
Friday	Practise the grapheme /ey/. Write the phoneme in the air or on someone's back. Practise writing these words: donkey, jockey, turkey, trolley, tronkey, surkey, strolley, quockey. Remember to add sound buttons

Read these sentences: Can a jockey win on a donkey? Will a girl put a trolley in a turkey? Did Santa get stuck up the chimney?



Maths			
Monday WALT: Use number bonds to derive subtraction facts.	Today we are going to use number facts we already know. Use a part whole model (or draw your own). If we know that 5 + 4 = 9 then we know 9 + 4 is equal to 5. We know that 9-5 is equal to 4 and 9 – 4 is equal to 5. Using a part whole model get any objects from around your house to use as the whole, and then subtract them into parts. The video will help support finding subtraction facts within teens numbers.		
Tuesday WALT: Use double to calculate near doubles.	Watch the doubles song: https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=AtoquRagors We know that doubles are adding the same number together eg 4+4=8 if we wanted to work out 5+4, we know that 4+4=8 so we need to add 1 more to make 9. Make double dominoes using strips of paper or whatever you have at home and write a calculation on each strip such as 3+3, 4+3. 3+3=6, a near double 3+4=7 so you can match up the number 3 to make a domino game.		
Wednesday WALT: Use the make 10 strategy.	Find 20 of the same objects in your home such 20 pieces of pasta, straws etc and start by making the number 14 using the objects. Now make 10- how many do you have left? So we know that 10+4=14. So if we had 7 red pasta pieces how many are another colour? You could draw 7 red buttons how may blue buttons would we have to make a whole of 14? Watch this link from Espresso Discovery Education Espresso - Song: What room have you got? (bridging through 10)		
Thursday WALT: Understand the equals symbol.	Make the equal symbol using objects you have around your home such as a pair of socks or two spoons to show the equals sign. Be as creative as you like to make an equals sign! If you have weighing scales at home, talk about different objects that can be measured. Choose two of the same object that are the same weight which mean they are equal/the same as in weight which shows they are equal. Then use the scales with objects that are heavier or lighter. For example, put 8 pieces of dried pasta on some weighing scales and then put 2 pieces of pasta on there- are they equal in weight? Why not? Extension: Explore using any objects from around your home (they will need to be the same objects) try to make them balance and be equal.		
Friday WALT: To understand the equals symbols represents equivalence.	Today we are going to use the equals symbols we made yesterday to help us to solve some problems. Draw 4 red circles on a piece of paper and them 3 blue circles next to them. Write the calculation 4+3= What is the total? The total is 7. So if we had the equation 4+3= _ +5. How many extra circles will need to make the equation balance? We know that 4+3=7 so 5+2=7. 2 will balance the equation. Have a go at writing your own equations such as 3+5=+4, draw around objects or draw circles on a piece of paper to help you to work them out.
