Suggested learning for the morning:

English – (upto 40 minutes) You are going to create and make a new character for your favourite story.

Handwriting – (upto 15 minutes) Today we will focus on spelling and forming the correct graphemes for the alternative /ai/ and /c/ phonemes as well as words that contain these sounds:
