<p><b>English (up to 30 mins)</b>  <b>Write to Impress</b>  WALT write using phonic sounds and tricky words.</p>	<p><b>Teacher VIDEO 1:</b>  What do we do next?  Now we have talked to Mummy Pig we need to decide what to do next. Do we go and look for the boys? Do we knock on someone's door and ask them for help? Do we check the woods for the wolf? <p><b>Phonics (up to 20 mins)</b>  WALT Read some letter groups that each represent one sound and say sounds for them. <b>Topic (up to 30 mins)</b> WALT represent our ideas creatively, using a variety of media.	Continue making items to take along on our journey. What have you made so far? Don't forget food and something to drink. You could draw pictures of things to pack as well. Make sure you have taken pictures of all the things you have made.

<b>Topic (up to 30 mins)</b> WALT use cutting and joining techniques.	Today we are going to be making a moving picture. Using paper and any kind of decorations you like make a scene from the three little pigs- then carefully cut a slit in the middle (making sure not to cut all the way to the end). Then choose a character to draw and cut out. Once finished attach your character to a stick- pop in through the slit you have made in your scene and you will have a moving picture.
