#### **Our Vision**

We support children with SEND to be included in all aspects of school life. Our Wellbeing Team led by our SENCo, are happy to talk to you about your child's needs and how we would be able to support them in school. We know that all children are likely to need a little extra help at some point in their BFIS journey, whether it be academic, emotional medical or other needs. We welcome parent/carers to ask for support and to work with us for their child to have the best possible experience at BFIS.

# **SEN Information Report**

On our school website, there is a link to our SEN Information Report. In this report, we identify how we support the children with Special Educational Needs and Disabilities in our school. The SEN Information Report also identifies the adaptions we have made to the curriculum and environment to support children. There are four main areas of SEN:

- \* Communication and interaction
- \* Cognition and learning
- \* Social, mental and emotional health
- \* Sensory and/or physical

#### **SEN concerns**

If you have concerns regarding your child's special educational needs, please make an appointment to see the class teacher who will refer to the SENCo if necessary.

#### **One Plans**

Children that are on the school's SEN register will have termly One Plan meetings. One Plan meetings are an opportunity for staff and families to get together and make choices with the child about how to support the child in meeting their outcomes for the future.

#### **Annual Reviews**

Children with an Education, Health and Care Plan (EHCP) will have one annual review a year. This is an opportunity for us to review the EHCP and see if the provision outlined is still relevant.

#### **Medical Needs**

Children with medical needs will be provided with a detailed Individual Health and Care Plan, compiled in partnership with the school nurse and parents and if appropriate, the child themselves.

#### **Accessibility**

In school, we have ramps around the school to support the movement of adults and children. Within the class, the teachers adopt various strategies that contribute towards an inclusive environment. Each class displays a visual timetable which is changed daily.
