Creative Task (at least 15 minutes)

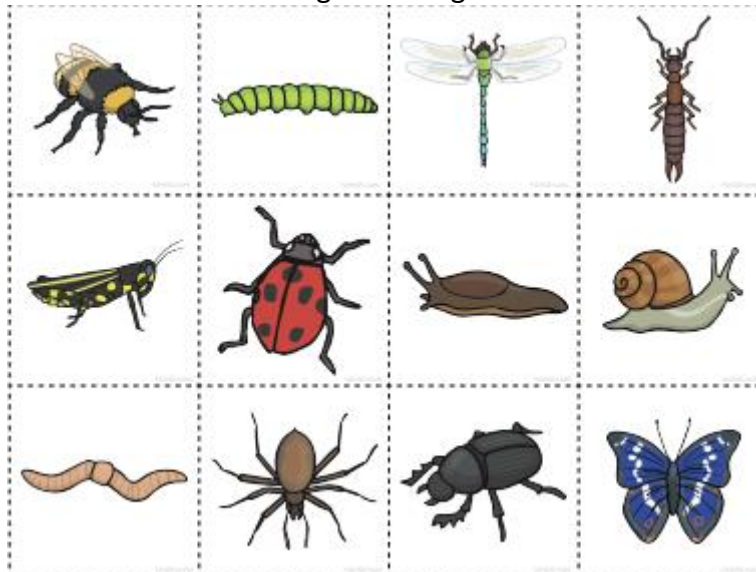
WALT design and construct a home for toilet roll bug/monster.
