English – Writing (20 minutes)

WALT retell a story.

Look at the story from yesterday again.

Are you happy that your story map tells the story? Make up actions for the important events in the story so that you can retell it. You can retell the story in your own words.

Choose a plant. It could be growing outside, inside or it could be a picture in a book or on the internet. Look very carefully at all the details. What shape are the leaves? Does it have flowers? Are all the edges straight lines or are there curved or wiggly edges to leaves or petals? Are there any tiny hairs on the stem or is the trunk of a tree all one colour?

Which part of the plant do these different foods come from? Can you write these headings on a page in your book.

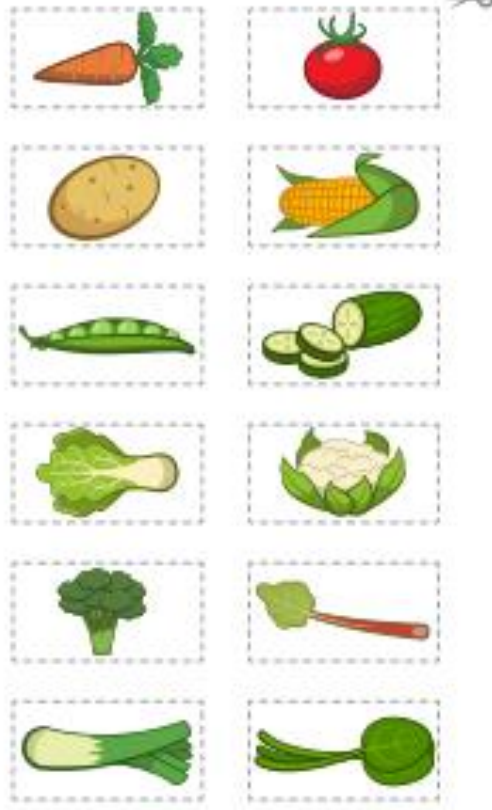
1. Leaf
