Active Task

Jump the River



How many players?

• 1 or more players

What do I need?

- Cones or household items as an alternative
- If you have some rope you could use it to mark out your river

Top tips...


- Bend your knees to give you power to jump
- Swing your arms backwards then forwards to go further
- Try not to fall over when landing by landing on two feet

Even more challenging...

- Make your river wider or bendy with different sized jumps
- Can you take off on one foot and land on two?
- Challenge your family members to see who can jump the furthest!

How to play the game?

- How far up the river can you jump?
- Start at the bottom of the river and try and jump across to the other side without landing in the water!
- Jump using two feet and try to land on two feet!
- Can you make the river wider to make the challenge harder?

Topic Task -15 minutes

WALT: To make and test a prediction.

Imagine you are stuck in the rainforest. What would be the best material to keep dry from all the rain?

Yesterday you did your experiment to test which materials are waterproof. Now it is time to write up your method and results.

In your purple books or any notebook/paper you need to write up your experiment using the subheading below.

<u>Prediction</u>- Which material did you think would be waterproof?

Equipment- what did you use? **Method**- what did you do?

Results- which materials did you find to be waterproof?

<u>Conclusion</u>- which material would you use to keep yourself dry in the rainforest and why?
