English – Writing (20 mins)

Identify the 4 that presented most challenge and practise writing them 3 times each
OR

Pick one /ai/ and one /ay/ word and write a sentence for each.

Active Task



Create between 3 and 5 fitness stations for your own circuit training.

You could do skipping, press ups, star jumps, running on the spot, plank, hula hooping etc.

Can you make up some of your own activities?

Once you have your stations, spend between 30 seconds to 1 minute on each station and then move on to the next. After you have finished all your stations have a short rest, about 1 minute and start your activities again. Repeat 3 to 5 times.

Creative Task



Be a photographer. Take photos of any deciduous and evergreen trees you can find. Can you get close up shots of the different leaves, buds or any fruits growing?
