Discuss what happens to the tree throughout the year.

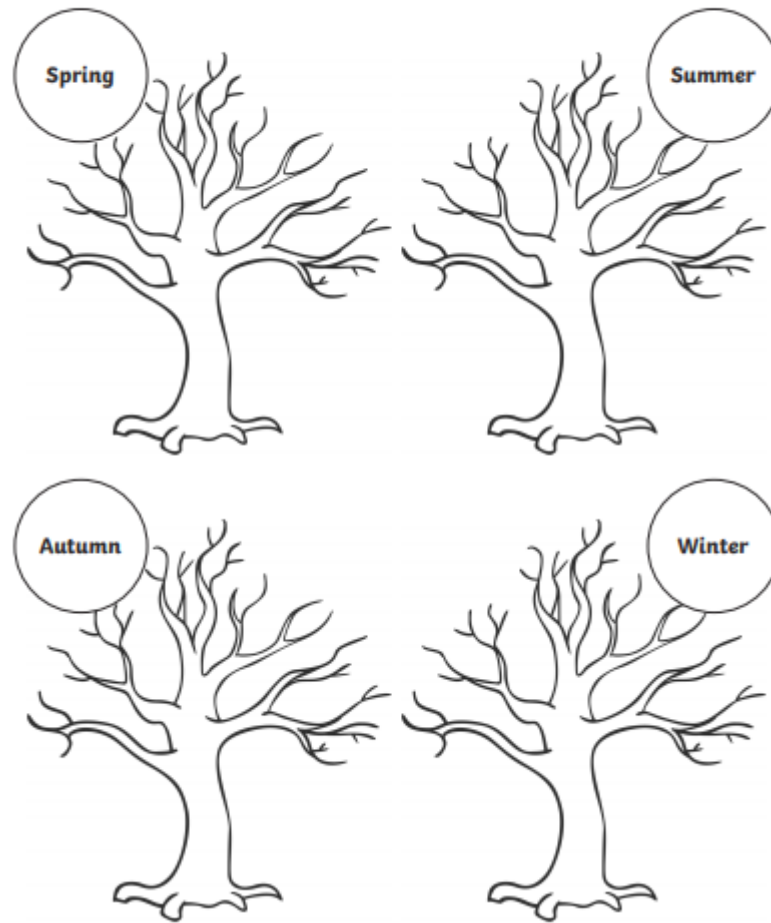
#### Topic Task (30 mins)
